

Sermon Notes

The Gospel today deals with Jesus crisscrossing the sea of Galilee and ministering to both Jews on one side and Gentiles on the other. By this arrangement of material Mark is declaring that Christ blesses both Jew and Gentile, near and far, clean and unclean. In the immediate context, Jesus had crossed the sea (4:35, 5:1) and performed an exorcism in Gentile territory, among pig farmers. He has now returned to the western shore (verse 21) to Jewish territory, and the two stories that follow are Jewish in context. One has to do with a synagogue ruler (verses 22-24, 35-43) and the other a woman who was, according to Jewish law (Leviticus 15:25-30), unclean by reason of her flow of blood. Both stories also carry symbolically the tradition of Judaism in the number twelve: the woman was ill twelve years (verse 25), the ruler's daughter was twelve years old (verse 42).

Mark on occasion will split a story and insert another story in the middle. The question is, "What does Mark intend by this formula?" You could see here no more than the style of a good story teller: the inserted story builds anticipation for the conclusion of the first. Or, one could say that the inserted story is logically necessary to allow time for the condition of the child to worsen and for her to die. But, since Mark has elsewhere used this structure to allow stories to interpret one another, we may assume this is the case here.

The stories are alike in their telling. Both involve cases of extreme need: the woman has exhausted all options and all resources and is now desperate; the child is gravely ill and dies before Jesus arrives. In both stories, large crowds are on the scene to see what is happening. As for the disciples, they are blind to what is going on. In the case of the woman, they are so excited about the big crowd they cannot distinguish between a push or a touch. These two stories are joined at a deeper level.

Perhaps it would be sufficient to say that Mark, concerned to show the power of the "stronger one" (chapters 1-8), here offers an example of Jesus overcoming sickness and death. But the Jesus who ministered among foreigners (verses 1-20) is here among his own people moving across religions and social barriers to offer God's healing and grace, but also to show God's love.
