

Lectionary Text for Next Sunday

I Kings 8:1, 6, 10-11, 22-30, 41-43 Ephesians 6:10-20 Psalm 84 John 6:56-69

The readings for each Sunday—typically one each from the Old Testament, Epistles, and Gospels—provides a systematic approach to the use of scripture in worship.
