

Lectionary Text for Next Sunday

2 Samuel 11:26-12:13a Ephesians 4:1-16 Psalm 51:1-12 John 6:24-35

The lectionary is a three-year cycle of selected collections of suggested scriptural readings from the Bible that can be used for worship, study or other theological uses. The readings for each Sunday—typically one each from the Old Testament, Epistles, and Gospels—provides a systematic approach to the use of scripture in worship. Its widespread use by United Methodists as well as other Christians testifies to its value in helping congregations hear the whole message of scripture.
