## Church History

- 1736 John Wesley, an Episcopal priest who later founded Methodism, visited an English settlement on Skidaway Island and conducted worship services. That same year, Charles Wesley also preached on Skidaway Island.
- 1979 Savannah District Board of Missions purchased 7.9 acres of land for \$47,000 on Skidaway Island to build a Methodist Church. The stipulation was that if the church was not built on the land within ten years the land would be sold back to the Branigar Organization, Inc.
- 1982 Hamp Watson, District Superintendent, formed a committee of members and pastors from five churches to discuss plans for the new congregation.
- On May 19th, interested persons met at Condo 44 at the Settlement with Dr. Ralph Bailey, who was to be the organizing pastor of the new church. There was great difficulty in finding a place for the services as we were turned down by many groups whom we asked to use their facilities. Ultimately, Branigar gave us the use of Condo 44. Everything needed for worship was loaned to us, including Baptist hymnals.
- On February 26th, 35 members, distributed among 14 family units, received certificates of charter membership. In October, the United Methodist Conference loaned us a newly built double-wide modular chapel to put on the church property (later the Conference took this building to another site to start a new church). In November the first worship service on our land was held in the modular chapel. We bought 100 chairs at \$35 each.
- 1985 On February 10th, Bishop Ernest Fitzgerald conducted the consecration service for the site as a place of worship. Later that year, a Sunday School program was started with about 10 people attending.
- 1986 Twenty-two family units initiated the first building campaign, and our membership grew to 55 people.
- 1987 In November, groundbreaking services were held for the 140 seat chapel.
- 1988 Rev. Jim Giddens was appointed in June to be our first full time pastor, and a house on Hemingway Circle was rented as a parsonage. On July 17th, Rev. Giddens officiated the first worship service in the new chapel. Union Camp kindly donated office furniture and a typewriter.
- 1990 Membership grew to 210, and a second service was added. The parsonage at 31 Hemingway Circle was purchased and the UMW was organized.
- 1991 With the membership now at 230, it was time to build again. Phase 1 would include a new fellowship hall, additional classrooms, parking facilities, a children's playground, a church library and a Memorial Garden. The UMM was organized.
- 1992 On February 28th, groundbreaking ceremonies were held.
- In February, the new facilities were consecrated, and the fellowship hall was named Bailey Hall in honor of Dr. Ralph Bailey. Later that year the Memorial Garden, with 96 niches, was consecrated, and a 7:45 am worship service was added.
- 1995 With membership now at 429, Bailey Hall was renovated for Sunday worship.

- 1996 A new organ and stained glass window were dedicated in Bailey Hall.
- 1997 Building plans for a sanctuary and additional offices and classrooms were approved, the Memorial Garden added 48 niches, and a plaque was placed to memorialize those whose ashes were spread in the garden.
- 1999 Membership had reached 750, and on January 10th, a groundbreaking ceremony for the Sanctuary and Education Building additions was held.
- 2000 Dedication of the Sanctuary was held on April 9th with Bishop Richard Looney and over 600 people in attendance.
- 2001 Stained glass windows depicting the life of Christ were added to the Sanctuary.
- 2002 Membership grew to 1000, and there were over 200 volunteers associated with missions and outreach programs.
- 2006 With a membership of over 1200, traditional worship continued to be our mainstay, and summer worship numbers grew significantly.
- A prayer labyrinth was constructed in memory of one of our members. "Skidaway East" was also constructed in India. A Visioning Committee was formed, and our Purpose and Vision were clearly defined as cornerstones for the "Journey to 2012."
- The children's playground was expanded, and a church bus was purchased. The Memorial Garden was expanded to include North and South flanks with 45 new niches on either side.
- In mid-August, we experienced a fire which damaged Bailey Hall and the educational wing. We were challenged, but with a tent, trailer, members' homes, much faith and ingenuity, we continued all programs, and our membership grew to 1238.
- 2011 A Memorial Wall was planned and installed, and fundraising was begun for a new organ.
- 2012 Growth continued in all areas, and we added 62 new members. The new Colby organ was dedicated on October 21st, with Dr. Timothy Albrecht in recital.
- 2013 Membership was at 1345 and a special service was held to celebrate SIUMC's 30 year history and Jim and Linda Giddens' 25 years of ministry.
- 2015 Under the leadership of Jim Giddens, the church participated in the Kingdom Assignment project, resulting in donations of over \$86,000 to ministries and individuals in need.
- 2016 Skidaway Island experienced the effects of a tornado and Hurricane Matthew. The church and community rallied together to support cleanup efforts.
- Renovation efforts are underway for the nurseries, children's rooms and youth spaces to better serve the increasing number of families attending SIUMC.

We are proud to celebrate the 30 year ministry of Jim Giddens as our senior pastor and celebrate with Jim and Linda as they transition into retirement. Our journey of faith continues...

## Reverend James W. Giddens

Jim Giddens was born in Valdosta, GA, in 1948, and grew up as a member of the Park Avenue United Methodist Church. He graduated from Valdosta High School in 1966, and from Georgia Southern in 1969. Upon graduation, Jim went to work for Owens-Illinois, Inc. in January of 1970 as a Personnel Trainee in their Valdosta Paper Mill.

Shortly thereafter, Jim met Linda Smart on a blind date, and they were married in October of 1970, just prior to his transfer to O-I's Big Island, VA Paper Mill, where he was named Safety Director. Jim then moved through a series of assignments in Valdosta, Orange, TX, and Chicago, the latter move in 1978.



It was while working in Chicago that Jim first felt called to the ministry. Thinking that he might just be tired of personnel work, he asked to go into sales. He did this for four years, before moving to Houston, TX. Finally, the call was so profound that he resigned from Owens-Illinois, and enrolled in Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta. It was now 1984, and the Giddens had three young boys (Jim, Kyle, and Chris).


While in seminary, he was appointed to a two-church charge (Fincher/Molena Charge), in Meansville, GA. This provided a small stipend and a parsonage for the family. He carpooled back and forth to seminary with three other student pastors. After three years of seminary, Jim graduated and was appointed as the Associate Pastor of Wesley Monumental United Methodist Church in Savannah, GA.

After a year, he felt the desire to serve a congregation of his own. In late 1987, he was encouraged in this calling by Dr. Ralph Bailey, who was the Chaplain at Candler Hospital and the startup minister at Skidaway Island United Methodist Church. Rev. Jimmy Pennell, the Savannah District Superintendent supported Jim's appointment to Skidaway Island United Methodist Church in 1988.

When Jim arrived, construction was just being completed on the Chapel. Jim led the first worship service in the Chapel in July 1988. Under Jim's pastoral leadership, the congregation began to grow exponentially, quickly facilitating the need for additional worship and ministry spaces. Through the years, Jim has led this congregation to a deeper faith through his meaningful sermons, study and teaching of God's word and compassion for those who are hurting.

We, the congregation of Skidaway Island United Methodist Church, give thanks to God for the 30 year ministry of Jim and his wife, Linda. Jim has offered this congregation and community an example of a servant leader with a heart for loving others. Together, they have devoted their lives to furthering God's kingdom here in Savannah, on Skidaway Island, and beyond, and for that, we are eternally grateful. Their hard work and dedication are a testament to the Christian example of servanthood. We pray God's richest blessings on them as they enter into retirement and hope that the years ahead are filled with joy and peace.
